



## Elanor J. Richardson

November 10, 1939 - October 11, 2020

Elanor Joann Richardson, was born November 10, 1939, in Lesterville, Missouri, the daughter of Lee and Clarice Helems, and passed away October 11th, in San Antonio at the age of 80 years.

Better known as Joann, she was introduced to the love of her life and husband of 63 years, Wesley, by her brother, Jack Helems, marrying at the age of 15 and he, 18 years of age. Never meeting a stranger, she is remembered for her genuineness, friendliness and love. A beautiful person, on the inside and out, her warmth, personality, and compassion shined through to others. In spite of battling several health issues, she was strong, courageous, and perseverant. She is an incredible inspiration to us all.
