July 1, 1918 - September 15, 2007

Mensa member Eleanore Gardner was born Eleanore Anna Strandberg on July 1, 1919 in Roseau, MN to Peter and Margaret Strandberg and passed away on September 15, 2007. Being the 7th of eight children she enjoyed her childhood on the family farm. In order to attend High School she had to live in town and work for room and board. After graduating Roseau High she pursued a career as a Registered Nurse and graduated from Deacones Hospital in Grand Forks ND. While working in Grand Forks she met and married Warrant Officer and Glider Pilot Leland Gardner and together they had five children. After WWII they settled in San Antonio where Eleanore worked as an RN at the Nix hospital, also doing private duty. For fun she enjoyed table games with her children and was an expert bowler using her nickname Oley. She was considered one of the city's premier bowlers and was on a WIBC league championship team six consecutive seasons from 1961-1962 to 1967-1968 and had a high game of 299 in 1964 and high series of 710 in 1965. After her divorce in 1969 she turned her attention away from bowling and could be seen dancing the night away at the Roaring 20's. She also left nursing at this time and became a personal counselor. She helped many people make good choices in everything from career moves to romance. She is survived by Suzan Gardner of San Antonio, her daughter Lexey Lee Krause and husband Derek and sons Ellis and Evan of Austin; son, Jim E. Gardner and wife Lee and daughter Megan of Bandera; son Billy Gardner of San Antonio; sister Verna Sloan and family of Edina MN; niece
