His apt barbecue skills and endearing joyous personality were beloved by friends and family alike. Throughout the years, Mr. Garcia and his wife, Angelina, generously sponsored many seminarians and immigrants who were seeking to fulfill their vocations and aspirations for a better life. He was a loving husband, father, grandfather, great-grandfather, and friend. Survivors include
