ELIZABETH BRADEN CARTER entered eternal rest on Friday, October 23, 2009. She was born in Columbus, Texas on November 2, 1918, to Herman and Elizabeth Jacobs Braden, the youngest and last survivor in a family of six girls. She is preceded in death by her husband, Paul Thomas Carter, and one son, David Payne-Carter, as well as her sisters Hazel, Emily, Marceline, Hermasella, and Evelyn. Surviving her are three children, Betsy D'Angelo and husband, Nick, Steve Carter and wife, Broncine, Sam Gilliam and husband, Steve, six grandchildren and eight great grandchildren. Elizabeth graduated from Columbus High School in 1936 as salutatorian, was editor of the school newspaper, and a member of the Tennis Team.
