Elmer Fritz Kettler passed away October 25, 2009 in Floresville, Texas. Born July 23, 1917 in Taylor, Texas, he was preceded in death by his wife of 61 years Marie Raschke Kettler, parents Fritz Kettler and Emma Muegge Kettler, sister Hattie Kettler Seaholm, and cousin Ruby Muegge Byrd. Elmer held dual membership with the New Braunfels Lodge. He was a member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church in New Braunfels. An avid hunter and fisherman, Elmer loved the outdoors. Known by his many friends as Butch or Buster, Elmer had a knack for building close friendships with anyone he met and was humbled and honored when awarded the Golden Trowel by the Masonic Lodge.
