



Eloisa V. Torres

March 27, 1939 - February 17, 2021

It is with great sadness and a heavy heart that our beloved sister, aunt, and friend Eloisa V. Torres entered eternal rest on February 17, 2021 at the age of 81 after a brief illness arising from COVID-19. Eloisa was born on March 27, 1939 in San Antonio, Texas to Tomas and Juanita (Villesca) Torres.

Rest In Peace Aunt Loy. I love you. ❤️

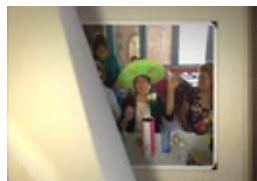
