



Elvira N. Stahl

January 25, 1941 - April 23, 2022

Elvira Nevarez Stahl, 81, of San Antonio, Texas, passed away at home on Saturday, April 23, 2022 surrounded by her three children.

Born January 25, 1941 in Durango, Durango (Mexico), she was daughter of the late Santiago Nevarez and Josefa C. Carmona. Elvira began her life in the United States in 1960 in Fort Stockton, Texas, sponsored by her brother-in-law the late Marcus McCracken, a commissioned officer of the USAF. She later moved to San Antonio where she met her husband on the San Antonio Riverwalk while waiting tables at Casa Rio. Elvira and her husband later owned and operated a Mexican restaurant in the 80's and later in the 90's opened an antique business together. Among her many accomplishments, becoming a naturalized citizen of the United States was among the highest. She is preceded in death by her husband, Lloyd R. Stahl; Sisters: Cathy Robertson, Maria de Los Angeles Salgado and Irma Banuelos.

She is survived by her son, Jonas Stahl of San Antonio, TX; daughter, Christianna Stahl of Beaumont, TX; daughter Johanna Stahl Mandel and husband, Adam of Pflugerville, TX; two grandsons, Drew and Weston Mandel. Brothers-in-Laws and numerous nieces, nephews, cousins and friends.

A Memorial Mass will be held at noon on Tuesday, May 3 at St. Mary Magdalen Catholic Church. Elvira will now rest next to her Mother, Josefa C. Carmon at San Fernando Cemetery II in San Antonio, TX.
