Elvis John Hagen was born April 23, 1919 in Dubois County, Indiana to Conrad and Anna Hagen. Nine children were born to this family. Three brothers and four sisters precede Elvis in death. Elvis attended the public school system in Knox County, Indiana. After his public education, he joined the United States Army in 1942, serving in World War II. After his military service ended in 1945 in the Italian Campaign, Elvis worked at a glass factory in Vincennes, Indiana as an inspector. Elvis met his sweetheart Mary Lou Evans in 1949, and they were married in 1950 in Vincennes, Indiana. They moved to Indianapolis, Indiana right after their marriage. Elvis became employed with General Motors. He worked for General Motors for thirty years and six months. He retired in 1981 from General Motors. Elvis and Mary Lou came to San Antonio, Texas in 1985 and became permanent residents in 1990. Elvis was baptized in the Lutheran Church in Dubois County, November 1919.
