Elvis J. Sexton (John), 79 of San Antonio, TX passed away June 12, 2021. John was born in Hickman, Kentucky on December 6, 1941, to John Harvey and Audrey Louise (Younger) Sexton, married January 7, 1937, in Hickman, Kentucky. John lost his father when just a boy, but his mom lived a very full life. John was drafted during Vietnam and after his tour left the military only to return a few years later, after serving at multiple duty stations both overseas and in the USA, he wrapped up his military career at Fort Sam Houston, TX, retiring as Sergeant First Class. John enjoyed doing carpentry projects, working on cars, racing cars, watching NASCAR, fishing (especially at the coast), going on casino gambling trips, and participating in Chili Cookoffs to raise money for good causes. John was a giving man who was ready to help others in need and never wanted to see anyone go hungry.
