



## Ernest E. Marroquin, Jr.

September 26, 1923 - August 5, 2008

### MARROQUIN

Ernest E. Marroquin Jr., born on September 26, 1923 in San Antonio, passed away on Tuesday, August 5, 2008. He was preceded in death by his parents, Ernest E. Sr. and Petra Gonzales Marroquin; brothers, Raymond T. Marroquin and Arthur R. Marroquin. He is survived by his loving wife of 60 years, Lucy Tinoco Marroquin; his children, Ronald R. Marroquin Jean, Gerald E. Marroquin Cindy, Dale P. Marroquin, Dwayne J. Marroquin, Scott A. Marroquin Michelle all of San Antonio, Elizabeth A. Kohler Tom of Paducah, KY, Annette M. Sudyka Steve of Kerrville, TX, Kevin P. Marroquin Becky of Ashburn, VA and Arthur R. Marroquin of Ann Arbor, MI who was like a son. He is also survived by his sister, Blanca M. Hodge, 22 grandchildren, 4 great-grandchildren and several nieces and nephews. Ernest graduated from Sidney Lanier High School in 1941, attended San Antonio College and was a Constable for Precinct 3. He was a WWII Veteran, a member of Company C, 146th Combat Engineers. Ernest served in the European Theater, surviving Omaha Beach, Battle of the Bulge and the Liberation of Paris. Upon his return from the war, he went to work at Kelly AFB for 39 years before retiring in 1981. He devoted his life to his wife and to his children through his involvement of coaching Little League, Knights of Columbus, and being a devoted member of Holy Spirit Catholic Church since 1974.
