Ernest Ernie Neill Uhles went to be with the Lord June 11, 2011. He was born in Coulterville, Illinois December 20, 1928. He is survived by his beloved wife of 62 years Norma and their children Gail and Paul DeGrove and Keith and Graciela Uhles. He first served as head of the Plating Lab. Later he served as Deputy Chief of Engines Division and ended his 30 years at Kelly as Deputy Director of Special Weapons. During his tenure at Kelly he wrote the book How to Become an Effective Supervisor. Ernie came to know Jesus as his savior at Pilgrim Presbyterian Church and later joined Churchill Baptist Church where he taught adult Sunday School and served as a deacon for many years. Visitation with the family will be held Monday, June 13, 2011 at Mission Park Funeral Chapels North from 6:00 to 8:00 PM. A celebration of Ernie's life will be held Tuesday, June 14, 2011 at Churchill Baptist Church, 12400 Vista View, at 10:00 AM with burial following at Mission Burial Park North. Ernie's
