Esther taught school for 35 years, with stints as she traveled with her husband, missionary school in San Juan, Texas and for 29 years with SAISD primarily at Inez Foster Elementary.

Esther was active in at The Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd, San Antonio, Texas; participating with the quilting ministry and former board member of the day care. She also served in the choir and library. Esther was a loving mother and often ran the home as August traveled for his employment. She loved her extended family which included the church and her many cousins, often hosting major holiday events at her home. She traveled extensively in retirement with 2 driving trips to Alaska, various locations in the United States, Canada and to Europe. Esther was always ready to go on a trip.
