She was an excellent cook and enjoyed preparing meals for family and friends. Thanksgiving meals prepared by Robert and Ethel were something the rest of the family looked forward to all year.

Prior to becoming a member of Northwest Church of Christ, she attended Oak Hills, Boerne, and San Pedro church of Christ where she made many friends. She maintained those friendships over the years and saw many of them at monthly “Lunch Bunch” luncheons which she organized. She also enjoyed the long friendships she had with her neighbors.

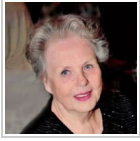
