Eugene Langdon Anderson was called home on June 26, 2011 surrounded by his beloved family. He is survived by his loving wife of 63 years, Lyn, and their daughters, Lynda Taylor and husband Ron, Mary Tawney and husband Mike, and Diane Brooks and husband Jim; his grandchildren Amy Biggs, Missy Rodriguez, J.R.
