



## Eugene Patrick Guckian

January 12, 1923 - October 13, 2005

Eugene Patrick Guckian passed into eternal life at the age of 82 on October 13, 2005, in San Antonio, Texas. He was born in Lockhart, Texas, on January 12, 1923, to William Patrick and Alta Mercer Guckian, who moved to Gonzales when Eugene was a child. At a young age he joined the National Guard and served in the U.S. Army. During WWII, he took part in the Salerno Landing and saw combat in Italy and North Africa. He married Margaret Brzozowski, also of Gonzales, in 1944 and the couple later moved to San Antonio to raise their family. Eugene retired in 1981 from Electronic Security Command at Kelly A.F.B. after approximately 36 years of Federal Service. The Guckians are charter members of St. Benedict Catholic Church. Eugene was a 4th Degree member of the Knights of Columbus Council 4315 and the St. Benedict Men's Club. After refining his homemade barbecue sauce over the years, he brought Daddy's Country Style BBQ Sauce to HEB Food Stores in 1997. Eugene and Margie were married 61 years in August. Throughout his life, Eugene loved family, fishing, and barbecue. He is survived by his wife, Margaret; children: Patrick Lynn and wife Judy, Jo Ann and husband Bill Zimmermann, Mary Kathryn and husband Tim Raffety, Betty Lou Guckian and Deborah Jean Harrison; daughter-in-laws Kelly and Lois Guckian; 13 grandchildren and five great-grandchildren; brother George Guckian and wife Frances and sister Marie McElven.
