Ezekiel Castro, Jr. went to be with the Lord on Thursday, October 10, 2019 at the age of 83. Ezekiel was born on January 25, 1936 to Esequiel Castro Sr and Margarita, in San Antonio, Texas.

Ezekiel is preceded in death by his loving wife of 37 years Angelita Castro; 4 brothers (Fred, Felix, Adam, and David) and 4 sisters (Maria, Eloisa, Eva, and Dianne).
