Always a sharp dresser, mom never left home without her hair coifed (thank you Mary!), her lipstick applied and proper jewelry to accent her outfit.

She was a smart businesswoman who knew how to drive a hard bargain, and taught us well the importance of money management. She was a realtor for several years working for Strauder Nelson Real Estate.

She enjoyed playing hand-held video poker, working crossword puzzles, doing word searches, reading the newspaper front to back and keeping up with current events. She had an uncanny memory and could recall facts and names others long forgot.

Above all, she loved her family, rejoicing in having 2 grandchildren, Dawn and Steve, and even more joy when great-grandchildren Carson, Camden and Ella arrived. Her joy grew when Dawn married Scott and Steve married Lory, with PJ adding to her great-grandchildren list.
