Fernando (Fred) Lozano Jr. joined our Lord on Monday, June 12, 2023, in San Antonio, Texas surrounded by family in the comfort of his home. Fred was preceded in death by daughter Rosie Jackson (David), parents Fernando and Sara Lozano, and in-laws Samuel and Lois Cortez. Fred was a man of great faith, love, integrity, and compassion. He was an active member of Holy Rosary Catholic Church for over 56 years and served in multiple capacities throughout the years. He especially loved working with the St. Vincent de Paul Society and the Nursing Home Ministry helping those in need. He served in the US Navy on the aircraft carrier USS Bon Homme Richard. Fred was an avid golfer and loved teaching his children and grandchildren the game. His regular assessment of his golf skills was, "I putt like a gorilla." He loved a good joke and was often engaged in retelling the good ones. Fred retired from KSAT-12 TV station as chief engineer after 38 years of service. He always said that one day he would be going to that, "big TV station up in the sky," and now he has. Fred took to heart the Lord's call to serve others and carried it out every day of his life. When you were with Fred, he gave you his time and his heart. The well of his love was deep and he gave it willingly to all who were a part of his life.

He ordinarily showed up to work in a coat and tie, but if there was need to get dirty, off came the finery, the sleeves got rolled up and he was in the thick of it.

Fred, Bill Kiley, and Ralph Joseph were the trio that kept the towers and the transmitters in good health. Sometimes, on a challenging day things could get a little salty, because the three of them knew salt. Fred and Bill, I know, were both Navy veterans.

Fred, Bill, David Carr were all amateur radio operators (hams) and on occasion Fred would recount his early radio days in the Navy, climbing up to the "crows nest" high above the ship on rolling seas to attend to a (radio) problem. (As I recall he used ham radio to keep in touch with his father while at sea)

I suspect some of the more colorful "Fredisms" may have been born in the naval service.

I know we are all going to miss his wit and warmth and kindness, but we can still keep his memory with us forever.
