



## Floyd Dale Brown

October 18, 1946 - June 28, 2020

It is with great sadness we announce the passing of Floyd Dale Brown on Sunday, June 28, 2020. Floyd was a man whose servant heart, laughter and generosity will be dearly missed by family and friends. He was a generous and gracious man who loved his family deeply. He was a kind man of character who made a difference in countless lives. Floyd was also a man of simple pleasures: He loved his country, He loved a hard day's work, and He loved to watch Western movies on a slow Saturday afternoon. Most of all, he loved his family.

Floyd was born on October 18, 1946 in San Antonio, TX to Ralph and Doris Brown. He grew up the eldest of three children in Bandera, Texas, graduating from Bandera High School in 1965. He was an active member of his high school's 4H program and raised hogs for the local livestock show(s). Upon graduation, Floyd entered the Army where he served as an MP. Upon leaving the military, Floyd trained to earn his license as a Master Electrician and spent his life in that career field. Floyd's dedication to his profession and his work ethic was something to be admired. He enjoyed his job and those he worked for and with and took great pride in a hard day's work. He was always an early riser, up before the sun rose and each day, he strove to be a better man than he had been the day before.

Floyd's passions were his family, friends, his love of history, and his love of

dancing. He was always particularly interested in genealogy and Civil War history and read and collected anything he could on the subjects. He was an active volunteer within the San Antonio Livestock Show and Rodeo organization where he served from 2003 to 2017 on multiple committees. He often spoke of the many friends he met and came to care about during his time with the Rodeo. His passion for the Mission of the SA Rodeo and the Children it supported continued thru his last days.

After stepping back from the Rodeo committees in 2017, Floyd became an active board member of Martinez Social Club. You could find him frequently assisting with various events and stepping up when needed, a trait that he carried out for most of his life. Floyd loved to dance and you could find him most weekends at Martinez with his lovely bride, Lynda, in his arms waltzing around the dance floor.

Some of his most precious memories were spent watching his 8 grandchildren in their many activities, cheering them on and showing his love and support in any way that he could. Whether it was attending a Dance Recital, a Sporting event, or a Livestock show his greatest joy was being a part of their moment to shine and letting them know in all ways how proud he was of them. His grandchildren would tell you there was nothing better than a Hug from Grandpa/Opa.

Floyd will be remembered for so many reasons, the biggest of these being his generosity of spirit. He was a great father and grandfather to his children and grandchildren and did his best to teach and guide them on life's journey. He would do anything to help a friend in need. Floyd always sought out ways to help others and would give you the shirt off his back if he thought you needed it more.

Floyd was preceded in death by his parents, Ralph Owen Brown and Doris

Ferris Brown. He is survived by his loving wife Lynda Brown. 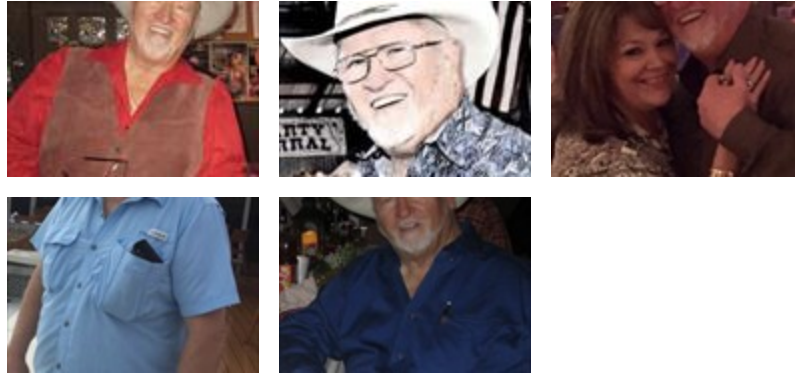
