August 30, 1947 - April 27, 2007

Floyd Gene Skip Cole of San Antonio passed away Friday morning, April 27, 2007 at North Central Baptist Hospital in San Antonio of complications relating to surgery. Mr. Cole was born August 30, 1947 in San Angelo, Texas to Alice Hendriex Cole and Gene Tunney Cole. He attended public schools in San Angelo, Big Lake, Longview, Amarillo, and other Texas cities. He graduated from Amarillo Tascosa in 1965. He attended The University of Texas at Austin prior to enlisting in the U.S. Army, where he was awarded the Bronze Star Medal for meritorious service in Vietnam. Following military service, Mr. Cole attended Trinity University of San Antonio, graduating with a degree in organic chemistry, and West Texas State University, where he earned a Master of Science degree in computer sciences before embarking upon a distinguished professional career in information technology. Mr. Cole was preceded in death by his beloved wife, Sally Frazier Cole, in 1996. He is survived by his son Scott Jay Cole, daughter-in-law Katie Cole, and grandson Peyton Cole of Seguin, Texas and by his son Christopher Adam Cole of San Antonio, and by legions of loving friends. Services are scheduled for Monday, April 30, 2007 at 9:00AM at Mission Park Funeral Chapels North. Interment will follow at Mission Burial Park North.
