October 30, 1927 - September 13, 2010

Frank Joseph Marecic Marcie, born October 30, 1927, in La Grange, Texas, died on September 13, 2010 at the age of 82. He was the son of Dr. Frank Marecic and Olga Nesrsta Marecic of Flatonia, TX. He was preceded in death by his wife of 39 years, Virginia Small; his father; mother and sister Katherine. He is survived by his daughter, Barbara Thaxton of Henderson NV; sons Frank Jr. and Patrick of San Antonio; 9 grandchildren and 2 great-grandchildren. After graduating from Flatonia High School he attended St. Mary's University in San Antonio. He received BS '49 and MS '67 Degrees in Chemistry. He served in the US Air Force as an Electronics Instructor at Keesler AFB, Mississippi and later as Airborne Electronics Officer at Kelly AFB, Texas. He attained the rank of captain. After separation from the AF, he went to work for Civil Service at Kelly AFB in the Regional Environmental Health Laboratory, later named the USAF Occupational & Environmental Health Laboratory located at Brooks AFB, TX. He served in several positions with the Laboratory, including: Special Projects Chemist; Chief Occupational Chemistry Branch; Chief Quality Assurance Branch and Chief Analytical Chemistry Division. After 33 years of service he retired from Federal Service but continued as a contract Consultant to the Air Force for another 2 years. Frank is a licensed pilot, starting while in high school and college; culminating with building and flying his own experimental aircraft in 1998. He was a Ham Radio operator W5WSY and a member of the Military Affiliate Radio System serving as Asst. Stage Director. He attained the rank of Eagle Scout with

Silver Palm and served as Scoutmaster and Merit Badge Counselor. He was a Past governor of the Loyal Order of Moose, Lodge 744 as well as serving on the State Board of the Texas Moose Association.
