Frank Saucedo, devoted husband, caring father, and fun-loving grandfather, passed away peacefully at home surrounded by family on December 20, 2006 at the age of 77. A San Antonio resident of 55 years, he was born on November 20, 1929 in Eagle Pass, TX, to Ignacio Saucedo and Simona Lopez.
