



Frank Laurette Wallace

December 25, 1927 - August 27, 2021

Frank Laurette Wallace passed in peace and entered heaven on August 27, 2021. He was born to Frank G. L. and Agnes King Wallace on December 25, 1927, in San Antonio, Texas. At the age of 16 he gave his heart to Jesus, which influenced the rest of his life.

He graduated from Texas A & M, class of '49. On March 10, 1951, in San Antonio, Texas, he married Mozelle Adams of Pearsall, Texas. Shortly after they married, he was drafted into the US Army and went to bootcamp in Virginia. Following bootcamp he was stationed in Chicago, Illinois. His first two daughters, Marsha Jo and Melissa Ann, were born there. He was discharged from the Army on May 9, 1953 and moved his family back home to Texas. Frank had three more children, two girls, Nancy Sue and Kelly Kay, and one son, Frank "Sam" Jr. His family and being an Aggie came second only to God.

Frank did many jobs throughout his life. He was a jack-of-all-trades, but unlike the idiom, he was a master of all. His walk with Christ was reflected in all he did. We will miss him greatly but rejoice in his presence with God. He is survived by his wife, Mozelle Adams Wallace; four of his children, Marsha (Mark) Aldridge, Melissa (Larry) Van Buren, Kelly (Mark) Eakins and Frank "Sam" (Maggie) Wallace; 13 grandchildren; 30 great-grandchildren; and numerous nieces and nephews. He is preceded in death by 1 daughter, Nancy Kemp and 2 grandsons.
