Fred S. Schodts, 85, passed away Wednesday, November 21, 2018 in San Antonio, TX. He was born December 8, 1932 in San Antonio to Fred and Bernice Mueller Schodts. Fred was a 1952 graduate of McAllen High School in McAllen, TX. As a teenager, he and his twin brother, Joe G. Schodts, built a Jeep from scratch with the help from their uncle Dave Schodts, who owned the Willys Jeep franchise in San Antonio. Having worked for Willys Jeep calling on dealers, Fred became very knowledgeable about cars, car parts, and negotiating deals. That knowledge led him to Arizona to accept a position of District Manager for Sealed Power. Fred met and married Jessie ("Jodi") Clement while working in Arizona. From there, the couple moved to Pennsylvania, Tennessee, and Michigan before retiring to San Antonio in 1990. Fred's illustrious career advanced from District Manager, Regional Manager, Assistant Sales Manager, and finally Sales & Marketing Manager upon retirement. His beloved wife, Jodi, passed away in 2002. Fred met Olga Diaz in 2003.

Both were widowed,
and they shared many good times together with Olga and her family. Olga renewed his spirit and gave him purpose. They were best friends and confidantes, traveling companions who spoke each day by phone until Olga's death in 2014.
