Dad, Gary, his younger sister and brother. Gary gave up a lot of his childhood taking care of us while dad worked. He also helped dad and our grandfather with their washateria and car wash in the summer cleaning them up, maintaining the washers and dryers, mixing up soap and handing out change. Gary would take us to our scout meetings and occasionally had to take us on his dates (😬) when dad worked late. He was a very responsible young man. Married a lady right out of high school and instantly had 2 step kids. He began his retail career at Winns as an assistant manager right out of high school and worked as a manager moving around opening or revamping stores. He ended his retail career at Family Dollar. Gary was very creative and loved working with his hands building things. I remember him and dad building a slot car race track out of a big piece of plywood, sawing groves in it and placing silver electricly tape for the cars to run on. They hooked up wiring box and hand controllers for each car. I also remembered the Christmas village/scenery they would contract on 8x10 plywood using paper mache every Christmas. They created tunnels and mountains for the train to run through using chicken wire as the base. Even used a mirror to create a lake iced over. Gary also loved to go fishing. He did this often in his early years and again when our dad retired. I will miss him dearly but will always remember him as the very caring and giving person he was. You may see an old man struggling to breath, I will always see the young boy climbing the tree.
