September 23, 1960 - November 22, 2023

George D. Abrego, 63, of San Antonio, Texas, passed away on Wednesday, November 22, 2023. He struggled with severe asthma. He is now with his Beloved Mother and Grandmother.

George was born in San Antonio, Texas to Hilda Maria De La Cruz Abrego and Jorge Espinoza Abrego on September 23, 1960. He attended St. Mary Magdalen School and Antonian Catholic College Preparatory High School. He enlisted in the United States Air Force and was stationed at McConnell Air Force Base in Wichita, Kansas as a dispatcher.

George was a talented artist and did auto body work from a very young age up to his time of death. At a very young age, about 10 years old, he was a journeyman at a local auto body shop, not even a block away from where he lived. There, he learned his trade of preparing and painting vehicles. He would later do paint jobs for various clients, from all walks of life. He was commissioned to do the 99.5 KISS truck in the 1980s - and it wasn't a wrap. He also did paint jobs for Peterbilt trucks and the United States Post Office trucks. At one point, he owned his own body shop by Hildebrand and Blanco.

Before her passing, our Mom bought George his first car, a 1967 Chevelle Super Sport 396 Big Block, maroon color and black vinyl top. He would take his brothers and sisters to school in it. That was an insane muscle car, ripping

through air like static electricity. The muffler sounded like the cadence of drums. He loved that car.

When he was 16, our parents passed away and he took the role of caring and supporting his three brothers, two sisters, and grandmother. He sacrificed opportunities for our benefit. Growing up, George wanted to make sure that his brothers and sisters were taken care of. George was so proud of each of us, his nephews, and niece. He would gladly be there for us whenever we needed him or to just hang out.

George wanted for all of us to be together and share each other's lives. He welcomed everyone he met. When he had conversations with people, he wanted to know you. He was funny and curious about things. Each one of us has our own stories to remember him...too many to tell here.

George made a great impact on us; he gave us examples of what to do and what not to do. He lived his life fully, with no regrets. He was a gentle man, a God-fearing man, and a great Big Brother. We will deeply miss you - your laugh, your big heart, your hugs, your generosity and humbleness. We know that until it is time for us to see you again, you will always be watching over us and taking care of us. We love you very much.

George is survived by his siblings: Enrique "Henry" (Glenda) Abrego, Felipe (Colleen) Abrego, Carlos Abrego, Sandra D. (Mark) Esquivel, and Blanca A. Poll; his nephews and niece: Angelo Del Valle, Mary Panelli, John A. Esquivel, Ian R. Poll, David M. Poll, Aeryn M. Poll and friends. He is preceded in death by his Mother, Hilda Maria De La Cruz Abrego and his Father, Jorge Espinoza Abrego.
