



## CMSGT George Randolph Fitzpatrick, USAF (Ret.)

September 14, 1942 - January 6, 2018

George Randolph Fitzpatrick, 75, of San Antonio, Texas surrounded by his family, passed away on January 6th, 2018 after a struggle with multiple illnesses. Born in McRoberts, Kentucky, and graduating from Kermit High School, West Virginia, he enlisted and proudly served in the U.S. Air Force for 26 years reaching the rank of Chief Master Sergeant.
