



George Robert Meehan

February 4, 1907 - August 27, 2005

George Robert Meehan died August 27, 2005 in San Antonio at the age of 98. He was born in San Antonio on February 4, 1907 to John Cunningham Meehan and Josephine Lusiecki Meehan. He attended St. Mary's School in downtown San Antonio. He also attended Harlandale High School and played center on the football team. He played baseball in the San Antonio City Major Leagues throughout in the 1930's as a right-handed pitcher for such teams as Public Service Utilities, Nu-Grape Bottlers, Bob Jones Café, Harlandale Athletics, and Southern Pacific Railroad. He also played for Floresville and Beeville and once pitched an exhibition game for Beeville against the San Antonio Missions in San Antonio. He went to work for Southern Pacific in 1937 as a Carman in the East Yards and he retired as a Car Inspector in 1972. George enjoyed hunting and fishing and was a big baseball fan his whole life; he coached and umpired in the Harlandale Little Leagues in the 1960's. He and his family were original members of St. Leo's Parish when it was organized shortly after they moved to Harlandale in 1921. George is survived by his wife of 57 years, Georgia, and their son John Anthony Meehan; one brother, James Anthony Meehan; grandsons, John Anthony Meehan, Jr. and Charles Daniel Meehan, all of San Antonio. He is also survived by Georgia's children Robert Gray and Patricia Gray Bass of San Antonio.
