



## George John Roeber

January 22, 1921 - December 19, 2017

George was born in Gonzales Texas to Otto George and Dena Anna Roeber. He and his two brothers and sister grew up helping to raise cattle and chickens and grow hay on the family ranch outside of Gonzales. School was about two miles away and on some days George was lucky enough to get to ride one of the horses to school rather than walking. After high school, where George played football, he moved to San Antonio where he went to business school and then served in the Merchant Marines during the war. It was at this time that he met Jeanette Lucille Weinert. They were married in Alamo Methodist Church in downtown San Antonio on February 27, 1943. They bought a house on the southeast side of San Antonio in 1945 where they raised their three children David, Danny, and Luanne and lived until 1975. It was a sad day in 1975 for George and Jeanette's friends, family, and church when George was transferred to Denver, Colorado. They had been pillars in their church, McKinley Avenue Methodist, where they served in many different capacities. The church had a large going away party for them.

George and Jeanette lived in Denver until 2010 where they became anchors in their neighborhood and close friends with their wonderful neighbors, and again became pillars of their church, Grace United Methodist. They loved Colorado and spent most weekends taking drives, camping, and fishing in the mountains, and enjoying Danny's family who lived in Colorado Springs. After retirement, they spent winters back in San Antonio and enjoyed time with

Luanne's family and George's relatives and became involved at Bracken United Methodist Church.

Jeanette's Alzheimer's had gotten worse and it was time to move back close to Luanne's family in San Antonio. Jeanette lived until 2012, when she went to be with the Lord. George had stayed with Jeanette as long as possible in the care facility and then moved in with Joseph, Stacey, and their two children and enjoyed lots of soccer games, birthday parties, and other activities. Joseph and Stacey gave him incredible loving care until November 2016. At that time he moved to Autumn Grove Cottage where the wonderful staff quickly fell in love with him and called him Papa. While at Autumn Grove, George still had plenty of family love from Luanne and Dena who alternately visited him daily, and Joseph, Stacey, Caleb, Sadie, and Steve who visited him often each week. David and Lisa and Danny and his family came to see him many times. George loved to hunt (in his younger years), fish, garden, camp in their travel trailer with great friends, invent and build things, serve at church, and just be with Jeanette and family. He had a beautiful garden in Denver where he grew apples, peaches, blackberries, roses, etc. While still living in San Antonio, George added two rooms to their house and designed and built his first camping trailer. When setting it up in the campgrounds, people from neighboring sites would stop what they were doing to watch him put it together.

While holding Luanne and Stacey's hands, George peacefully went to be with the Lord December 19, 2017. He was an incredible and wonderful husband, father, and grandfather. He will be greatly missed. He will be remembered for his love and devotion to Jeanette, his life of volunteering and serving, his quiet spirit, and his love and devotion to family. He was preceded in death by his parents and his two brothers and sister, Oscar and Johnny Roeber and Annie Mae Roeber Neuse. He leaves to cherish his memory: his children, David and wife Lisa; Danny and wife Jeannie; and Luanne Roeber Schuetze and

husband Steve; his grandchildren: Shannon Roeber Hieb; Joseph Schuetze and wife Stacey; Dena Schuetze; Blake Roeber and wife Ruth; and Kennon Roeber Snead and husband Braden; and his great-grandchildren: Amanda, Tyler, Hayden, Regan, Caleb, Sadie, Leorah, Isaiah, and Leivity.
