Gilbert Castañon, born on August 17, 1929 in San Antonio, Texas concluded his earthly Holy Journey on October 29, 2007. He was a member of the '47-'48 championship football team at Brackenridge High School, winning the Bronze Plaque which is displayed at Alamo Stadium. He received a football scholarship to play at Southwestern University, where he obtained his BBA Degree. Gilbert served in the US Army for 2 years during the Korean Conflict. He had a life-long career in the plumbing retail business, receiving several awards from local S.A. Business Associations.
