



Glen Howard Hartford

June 10, 1933 - July 20, 2020

Glen Howard Hartford entered into eternal rest on Monday, July 20, 2020 at the age of 87 in San Antonio, Texas.

Glen was born on June 10, 1933 in Sunburst, Montana, and grew up in Cut Bank. He graduated from Cut Bank High School in 1951, and worked as a freight clerk for Great Northern Railroad. He served as a radio operator in the United States Air Force from 1952 – 1956, and was stationed in Alaska, March AFB in California, Keesler AFB in Mississippi, and then Kelly AFB in San Antonio. While stationed at Keesler, he met Joan Matthews of Mobile, Alabama and they married in 1956. After the Air Force, Glen attended The University of Texas and graduated in 1959 with a BBA in accounting. Glen obtained his CPA license, and moved to Houston where he worked as an accountant for Humble Oil, then Coastal States Gas Producing Company, which later merged with Valero. Glen and Joan's three children were born in Houston. The family moved to San Antonio in 1979 where Glen continued working for Valero until he retired in 1991. He enjoyed doing tax work, and worked as an accountant for Jon Hart Designs for five years before retiring at age 65. Glen and Joan were members of St. Francis of Assisi Catholic Church since 1980.

Glen is preceded in death by his wife of 62 years, Joan Matthews Hartford; parents, Lewis Percy Hartford and Minnie Clara Grosser Hartford; and his five siblings, a sister Deloris Thompson, and brothers Cliff, John, Vernon, and Roy Hartford. Glen is survived by three children, Steven (Lynn) Hartford of

Waxahachie, Shaun (Mark) Danney of Fair Oaks Ranch, and Scott (Mellisa) Hartford of Bedford; and three grandchildren, Angela Danney of Magnolia, Nicholas Danney of Houston, and Blair Hartford of Waxahachie.

Glen enjoyed spending time with his grandchildren and was very proud that all three graduated from college (even if two were Aggies). He liked to joke and tell funny stories. He was active in his senior living community until the effects of Alzheimer Disease slowed him down in recent months. Glen passed peacefully in his sleep after a brief illness with coronavirus. Special thanks to the Memory Care staff at The Etta at Shavano Park, the Shavano Park EMS, and Encompass Health Hospice for their compassionate care of our Dad.

We will have a graveside service to celebrate Glen's life at Mission Burial Park North on Thursday, July 30 at 11:30 a.m. with military honors. 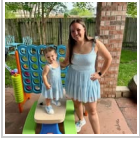
