Glenn Franklin Clamp, age 96, was born on October 2, 1909, in Brackettville, Texas. He passed away on June 29, 2006 at his home in San Antonio, Texas. After graduation from Brackenridge High School he became a tenant farmer. Then he became the owner and operator of a service station. Later he owned a taxicab company and after that he drove a dump truck to assist in the building of US Highway 87 to Kerrville. He was a hanger manager for the newly constructed San Antonio International Airport. He was drafted into the Army Air Corps and was trained in radar repair. He was also a 32nd Degree Mason, a licensed amateur radio operator and a private pilot. While a civilian, The USAF Security Service at Lackland AFB recruited him as an independent analyst. He was attached to the Joint Chiefs of Staff and answered only to Presidents Truman, Eisenhower, Kennedy, and Johnson. He is survived by his son, Kenneth, his cousin Storey, one granddaughter, 2 great-granddaughters, four nieces and five nephews, survives him.
