The home boasted a grand view of downtown San Antonio and anointed fine details of Spanish architecture and detailed craftsmanship. Bob loved this house. His memories of Grace, Werner, Carl, and his sister Waldine and others were a never ending joy to share.

Bob—the Frito Man Bob was born at 1416 Roosevelt St., just south of San Antonio, where homes were all wood clad and craftsman designed. During the latter period of World War 2, Bob proudly served his country by working in the Armory building situated on the River Walk, a peaceful stroll from historic San Antonio. But just a couple of addresses away, Bob found his next venture working for Frito Lay, an iconic company that started manufacturing corn chips just a short walk away from his home. Bob drove a route truck for Frito Lay for thirty years. He loved the work and the routes were to stores and restaurants he could point out as we drove around town.
