### Obituary for Guadalupe Oviedo

Guadalupe (Lupe) Oviedo was born on February 14, 1954, and passed away on February 12, 2025, at the age of 70. Guadalupe was preceded in death by her father Jose San Miguel and brother Claudio San Miguel. She is survived by her loving husband Alexander Oviedo of 30 years; her mother Guadalupe San Miguel; sister Genevieve (Joe) Sandoval; brothers Jose San Miguel Jr (Elizabeth), David (Mary) San Miguel, Robert San Miguel, Ralph San Miguel and San Juan San Miguel.

Guadalupe was born with the heart of a poet and the creative desire of a true artist. From an early age life, she was drawn to the church and all forms of art and creative expression. And, as the oldest of eight children, she modeled her expansive view of Love. She loved God. She loved music and dance and, of course, she loved literature and poetry. She wrote many poems of her own that filled dozens of notebooks in the room she shared with her younger sister, Genevieve, in the house where she grew up in, on Bickley Street. But her true calling was as a visual artist.

In an art class, while she was attending McCollum High School, she developed a love for painting, first with watercolors then with acrylics. Then, after her graduation in 1973, she began working on larger projects. In the mid-

to-late Seventies, she produced two wondrous glass murals that truly represented her devotion to God, her talent and her aesthetic sensibilities. The first, titled "Eve" was meant as a modern expression of the Mother of all Humanity and a gift to the Catholic Church. The second, inspired by her love for ballet and dance, for a time was displayed publicly in a Spanish restaurant and cabaret. Since their marriage, Lupe concentrated on maintaining her strong bond with her mother and on keeping the loving home she shared with her husband Alex. She will be forever in our hearts and dearly missed.
