Maria Guadalupe Rubio Salinas, August 27, 1918 - October 7, 2012 Lupe passed away peacefully at her home at the grand age of 94. She was born in Saltillo, Coah., Mexico, and immigrated with her family to the United States. One of her proudest moments, was becoming a naturalized citizen. She was a treasured lifetime member of the Ladies Auxiliary of VFW Post 76, the oldest VFW post in Texas, where she was respected and admired. She loved many types of music and enjoyed nothing more than celebrating the passages of life with family and friends. One of the favorite places in her later years was Estella's restaurant where El Trio Janitzio provided enjoyable music for the gatherings. This was a place of numerous birthday celebrations, the last of which was her 94th birthday on August 27, 2012.
