



## Guadalupe S. San Miguel

August 15, 1927 - April 21, 2025

Guadalupe San Miguel was a devout Catholic, a devoted wife and mother, a cherished sister, grandmother, confidante and friend. But she was also so much more to those around her. She embodied the resilience and strength of one who lived through the hardship of the Great Depression and World War II. She exemplified the heart and courage of those who had to make their way in the fields of beets, cotton and tomatoes as migrant workers following the crops to earn their meager wages. And finally, she personified the empathy and compassion of La Virgen de Guadalupe in the thousands of acts of kindness she performed throughout her almost 100 years of life.

She was, in short, a role model for us all - an inspiration for us to be humble, kind, principled and good-hearted. In that little house on Bickley Street, she raised eight children to be kind and gentle siblings and parents, patient and caring teachers, involved and engaged citizens, thoughtful and loving neighbors and empathetic partners and friends and, by the example of completing her GED in her fifties, she showed us all how to be lifelong learners. Most importantly, despite the numerous challenges of raising eight children on a civil servant's salary, she provided a warm and nurturing home and curated a wide range of extraordinary experiences like weeks-long beach vacations to Corpus Christi, countless trips to Conception Park and the Pan American Library and holiday traditions like tamaladas and the midnight mass on Christmas Eve. It's impossible to overestimate the impact these activities

had because they allowed her children to experience the world and their culture deeply and joyfully, and paved the way for them to flourish throughout their own adult lives. As the devoted mother she was, she demonstrated time and again, that her children's happiness and well-being were always her greatest priority and, grounded by her natural kindness, wisdom and grace, will forever remain the legacy of her remarkable capacity to love.

She is survived by, Jose Jr. and Elizabeth, David and Mary, Genevieve and Jose Maria, Robert, Ralph and San Juan. She has eleven grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.
