Hank belonged to the Christian Church.

Hank was well known for his baking of breads and treats even though he was legally blind and could barely see who was standing in front of him. He never let anything stop him from doing what he wanted to do and if you ever needed direction, Hank could give you a blow by blow description of how to get to you destination. If anything went missing, he would always say: "let the blind man find it!" and he would!

Hank and his wife Beverly were married for 46 years and he used to say' "We got married on Labor Day and I have been laboring ever since."

He is survived by his wife Beverly, four children Scott Daugherty & his wife Teresa, Brent Daugherty and his wife Yvonne, Traci De Leon & her husband Jake, and D'anne Schroyer & her husband Jon. He has 10 grandchildren and 1 great granddaughter. He is also survived by his sister Joyce Probasco of Chariton Iowa.

Hank was preceded in death by his father Harold Lincoln Daugherty, his mother, Edith Lois Duffield Daugherty, and his sister Helen June Daugherty Kline and two brother-in-laws.
