



## Harold Lee Eiserloh

June 1, 1925 - December 28, 2017

Harold L. Eiserloh has gone to the Lord December 28, 2017 at the age 92 in San Antonio, Texas. Born in Detroit, June 1, 1925 to Harold Joseph Eiserloh and Lillian Uhl Eiserloh. Harold was a 3rd generation San Antonioan. Survived by: wife, Fran Taylor Eiserloh, 5 nieces and nephews: Peter Eiserloh in California, Mitzi Eiserloh Stolicker and her husband Gary in Michigan, Karen Eiserloh in Phoenix, Paul Eiserloh in Wisconsin, and Alex Eiserloh in New York, as well as cousin David Lee Uhl in Texas. Preceded in death by parents and younger brother Norman A. Eiserloh.

He graduated from Edison High School in 1942. Attended San Antonio College 1942-43. Served in the Army in World War II, 1944 to 1946, as an Infantry rifleman in Alsace, France in the 44th Inf. Division. Received Bachelor of Architecture Degree from The University of Texas, Austin, June 1950 where he was a member of the Theta Xi Fraternity. Married in May 1953 to Frances Taylor at First Baptist Church of San Antonio.

Harold was an illustrator, architect and specifications writer with Phelps & Dewees & Simmons (Which later became Garza/Bomberger & Associates) from 1950 to 1993 (43 years). His last major project was the Texas State Aquarium in Corpus Christi, Texas. He was an active member since 1951 and Life Deacon at First Baptist Church of San Antonio. Member & past president of San Antonio Chapters of American Institute of Architects (1971) and

Construction Specifications Institute (1966). Life Member and Past President of Alamo Coin Club; Life Member of Greater San Antonio Camera Club. He and Frances presented slide travelogs at the Lions Field Adult Center. Member of American Legion; Disabled American Veterans, and 44th Inf. Division Assoc.

Visitation will be held Wednesday, January 17, 2018 at Mission Park North from 6pm to 8pm. A service will be held the following morning at the First Baptist Church of San Antonio beginning at 11 am and a small reception will follow at the church. A private Interment will take place at Ft. Sam Houston National Cemetery.
