



Harriet D. Burgess

July 4, 1918 - February 2, 2006

Harriet D. Burgess went to be with the Lord on Thursday, February 2, 2006, at the age of 87. She was born July 4, 1918, in San Antonio, Texas, to the late L. Kimberly and Caroline "Carrie" Dibble. She was a long-time member of Mount Olive Lutheran Church and more recently a member of St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church where she actively participated in the Golden Agers and served as President of the St. John's A.A.R.P. branch. She was a 50-year member of the Louise Schuetze Lodge of the Sons of Hermann. Her working career included the San Antonio Arsenal, the San Antonio Drug Company, and she later retired from Prudential Insurance Company. Even in retirement she worked as a Bexar County election judge, worked part-time for Galloway Research, and was an "Avon lady" for many years. One of her proudest accomplishments was her musical talent which she enjoyed sharing with others. She played first-chair clarinet in the Jefferson High School orchestra, and in the 1950's and 1960's she played saxophone and clarinet in the "Frank Fees and the Honey Bees" orchestra. She is survived by her daughter, Carol A. Oakes and son-in-law Ernest E. Oakes, and beloved cousin Hortense Koenig, all of San Antonio. Visitation will be held Monday, February 6, 2006 from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m. at Mission Park Funeral Chapels North. The funeral service will be held on Tuesday, February 7, 2006 at 2:00 PM, at St. John's Lutheran Church, 502 E. Nueva. Interment will follow at San Fernando #3 Cemetery formerly Roselawn Cemetery.
