



## Helen G. Geyer

August 20, 1924 - September 19, 2020

Helen passed away very peacefully and surrounded by her family on September 19, 2020. She is preceded in death by her husband William J. Geyer, Sr., her mother Irma Rivers Ganter, her father John Ganter and her sister Grace McCall. She is survived by her children, Ronald S. Geyer (Janice), William J. Geyer, Jr. (Carrie) and Julie Geyer. She is also survived by her grandchildren, Ashley Nichols (Chris Bryant), Austin Geyer (Whitney), Branden Geldart, Raegan Geldart and great-grandchildren Meredith Nichols, Weston Geyer and Ashlynn Geyer, and nieces Michele Denis and LeAnne Reaves and many more relatives and lifelong friends.

Born in Dallas on August 20, 1924, Helen moved to the King William district in 1936. She graduated from Brackenridge High School in 1941. She lived in King William for 84 years until her passing. She was very active in her community, serving on the PTAs at her children's schools for more than two decades, serving as a volunteer for NIOSA for many years and serving on the King William Association board in the 1970's. She was a founding member of her Bunco group where she was an active member for more than 60 years, and groups TOPS (Taking Off the Pounds) and KOPS (Keeping Off the Pounds). Helen worked at Ft Sam Houston as a civil servant during WW2.

She was very proud of the King William neighborhood. Her neighbors often see her in her yard gardening where she always had a friendly wave and time

to visit.

June was the last time we spoke, as she was the first person to call me when my Ex-husband passed away. Two weeks later a voicemail to wish me a happy birthday. She was... and still is a "forever" friend, one who you thank God above for the memories (even through the tears).
