



Helen Butler Nicholson

December 2, 1939 - June 14, 2024

Helen Butler Nicholson passed away peacefully into the arms of our Lord on June 14, 2024 at the age of 84. She was born to Sidney Olmstead and Fern Wheatley on December 2, 1939 in Tulsa, Oklahoma.

Upon the heels of the Great Depression, the family moved to Mobile, Alabama. During times of strife, Helen and her sisters were sadly placed in an orphanage. In order to ensure they remained together, their Aunt Nettie Corinne Smith (Midge) and step father Lehman Smith adopted and eventually relocated them to San Antonio, Texas. Midge affectionately became known as "Mother." Throughout her childhood and teen years, times were hard and money was scarce. However, their "mother" worked hard selling shoes for Sears, making their clothes, and eating left-over meals to ensure all of their basic needs were met.

Helen attended Brackenridge High School from 1954-1958. She was popular, made friends easily, and became a member of the Purple Jackets. According to her very close friends, Helen would even argue with her teachers on occasion to prove a point if she believed them to be incorrect and usually came out on top. Following graduation, Helen married her high school sweetheart, Raschel Butler, in 1959. In 1960, she gave birth to her son, Jeffrey Raschel, and in 1962, her daughter Judith Michelle followed. Helen was a stay-at-home mom. She adored her children and lavished them with so

much love, and nurtured them in the most beautiful way imaginable. During their early school years, Helen became a PTA mom. She attended all school activities and enjoyed taking cookies and cakes to the classrooms for teachers and classmates to enjoy. When her children appeared in school plays and sang in the school choirs, she always beamed with pride and joy. Vice-versa, Jeff and Judy beamed with pride and joy when Helen would arrive because she was the most beautiful mother in the world, inside and out.

As Helen's children became older, she entered the workforce and filled positions for secretarial work. She was highly energetic, motivated, strong willed, and tenacious. Unable to obtain a college degree due to hard times, Helen became very driven and more than determined to achieve successes and dreams she set her mind upon. In the late 1960's, Helen began working as secretary to the Lease Negotiator and General Manager of Wonderland Mall. Gaining knowledge and experience, she diligently strived to prove herself capable of assuming a management role. It was shortly after she became Manager of Wonderland Mall and, later, partner of a successful commercial real estate company, JLN&A. She continued this role until her passing on June 14th.

Divorcing in the mid to late 1970's, Helen's desire to further succeed became even greater and she thrived off being busy. Following her departure from Wonderland Mall, and continuing as partner in JLN&A, she decided to embark on an additional career in the medical field which would span 1989-2002. It was during this time, she participated in the most tumultuous changes overtaking the medical field at the time. Her knowledge and experience through these years became vast. She served in various management/directorial positions which involved oversight of medical services provided to 30,000 HMO patients; management of a marketing and public/community relations physician referral program for approximately 900 physicians and services; directed contracting, marketing, and public relations

activities for a large x-ray company and pathology medical group; and negotiated medical contracts.

Her biggest dream was obtaining a higher education. While working full-time, she attended San Antonio College in continuing education programs, primarily management and administration and executive and professional development. In 1988, she conferred her BA degree in management (Cum Laude) from St. Mary's University. Still feeling unsatisfied and wanting more, she went on to obtain her MA degree in Health Care Management (Suma Cum Laude) from Our Lady of the Lake University in 1996.

In 2004, she married Jack Nicholson (the original), making their lives whole, until his passing in 2016. Helen and Jack worshipped each other and their love for one another was nothing less than pure and unconditional.

Throughout her life, Helen loved giving to the community and devoted a lifetime to helping and serving the needs of many throughout San Antonio. When I close my eyes at night, I will continue to hear and cherish the words you always said before retiring for the night.....'I love you, baby.' We love you forever and always."

Helen leaves behind many who truly loved her. She was genuine through and through. Her effervescence was infectious and she was an inspiration to many, which permeated everyone through and through.

She is predeceased by her adoptive parents Nettie Corinne Smith and Lehman Smith, husband Jack Nicholson, sister Colleen Wilder, and former husband Raschel Butler. Her survivors include daughter Judy Butler McBride (Pat), son Jeff Butler, grandson Justin Butler (Crystal), great grandchildren Kaydie, Kylie, and Kaleb; sisters Marjorie Woodard of Corpus Christi, and Martha Schimmel of Reno, NV; former daughter-in-law Kimberly Gilroy-Butler (Ramon), numerous nieces and nephews, and life-time best friends Barbara Nobis-Murphy, Elaine Neenan, Rollette Schreckenghost-Smith, Gaylene Compton, Patrick Sturdivant, close friend Angie Bella, and numerous other friends.
