Herbert Rudolph Ott was born October 17, 1926 during a hurricane in Miami Florida and passed peacefully on April 21, 2019, reuniting with his beloved wife of 66 years, Jean. He served his country during WWII as “first” mechanic for the Motor pool, Asiatic-Pacific Campaign Ribbon, Army of Occupation Ribbon (Japan), Meritorious Unit Award - 1 star, 2 Overseas Service Bars, Victory Ribbon and was a proud retired Teamster.

He is preceded in death by his sister Mary. "Coach Ott" or "Big H" as some boys would call him, also coached Pop Warner football, women's softball, and assisted years later with basketball. Both he and wife Jean were avid spectators and supporters of their grandchildren, family, and friends; attending any event they were invited to.
