



Herman H. Kupfernagel

May 12, 1926 - October 3, 2016

Herman H. Kupfernagel, 90, passed away Monday, October 3, 2016 in New Braunfels Texas. Herman was born in San Antonio, graduated from Breckenridge High School in 1944, and proudly served in the U.S. Army 1st Infantry, 3rd Battalion, 26th Infantry Regiment. He participated in Rhineland and Central Europe Campaigns, including the Battle of the Bulge and other major Battles. Herman witnessed the Nuremburg Trials while assigned in Nuremburg, Germany supervising the Communication Section as Staff Sergeant, and Communications Chief.

After returning to San Antonio, Herman followed in his father's footsteps and began a lifetime career at Southwestern Bell Telephone Company, retiring after 40 years, in 1986 as the San Antonio Utility Coordinator. In 1947, while working in Kenedy Texas, Herman met Bobbie Roberson and knew in just a few weeks he would ask her to "be mine". They were married June 18, 1948 in Grace Lutheran Church and were blessed to be in-love for 68 years.

Herman lived with the highest Christian character, never wavering in his faith and devotion. He was a member of Grace Lutheran Church for 50 years, and later St. Paul Lutheran Church in New Braunfels, where he resided his last 11 years. He had many lifelong friends and was great support to the community through Telephone Pioneers, San Antonio Jaycees, Lions Club, and served on the Garden Ridge City Council.

Herman was preceded in death by parents Herman and Paula Kupfernagel; brother Paul Kuper, and great-grandson Wesley Grant. He is survived by his beloved wife Bobbie J Roberson Kupfernagel, daughter Judy Grant and husband Glenn, son Alan Kupfernagel and wife Suzanne. Grandchildren Jason Grant and wife Lyndsey, Cody Grant, Ashley Grant, David Kupfernagel and wife Bethany, and Steven Kupfernagel. Great-grandson Wyatt Grant, nieces and nephews.

A Celebration of Life service will be held at 10:30am Monday October 10, 2016 at Grace Lutheran Church, 504 Ave E, San Antonio. Afterward Herman will be interred at Mission Park North.
