



Herminia G. "Minnie" Cavazos

March 17, 1933 - October 23, 2024

In the early morning hours of October 23, 2024, our beloved mother, Herminia "Minnie" Cavazos, was called home to be with the Lord. Minnie was born in San Benito, Texas on March 13, 1933, to Jose Luis Gomez Linan and Virginia R. Gomez. She was one of 13 siblings. In 1952, she met Luciano G. "LG" Cavazos and were married on June 24th of the same year. They had 4 children: Jose Luis, Luciano, Jr., Carlos and Cynthia. Minnie and LG loved to travel for vacations and to visit relatives, whether it was in Texas, out of state or in Mexico. They celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary in 2002 before LG passed away from cancer in January of 2003.

Minnie was a devout Catholic and a long-standing parishioner of St. Benedict's Catholic Church. She and LG celebrated their 25th wedding anniversary there with a mass and renewal of their vows. She was a member of the Spanish choir and the Guadalupanas. You could count on Minnie to help with the annual church festival, where she and her fellow parishioners would sell Mexican food in one of the booths.

Minnie loved spending time with her children, her grandchildren and great-grandchildren. She loved to cook so much that she opened a restaurant in the late 70's and named it "Minnie's Kitchen". She ran it for 5 years and loved every minute of it. If she wasn't praying the rosary, she was either reading, doing a word search puzzle, or making family memories with a camcorder propped on her shoulder.

Minnie is survived by her 4 children, 10 grandchildren, 21 great-grandchildren and 3 great-great-grandchildren, as well as 2 sisters, 2 brothers and countless cousins, nieces and nephews. She will be greatly missed.
