Howard "Skippy" Jobson, loving husband, father, grandfather and coach, went to be with the Lord on July 19, 2011 in San Antonio, Texas. He was born on December 24, 1929 in El Centro, California. Mr. Jobson graduated from Jefferson High School in 1948 and Trinity University in 1953, where he was named "Little All-American" on the football team. He coached and served as athletic director for 35 years, coaching in Karnes City, San Benito, Alamo Heights, Junction and 30 years with the Harlandale ISD, serving as assistant football coach at Harlandale High School from 1959-1962 and was the first head football coach at McCollum High School from 1962-1965. Mr. Jobson served as athletic director for the Harlandale ISD from 1965-1989, where he was named to their districts hall of fame. He truly dedicated his life to serving the young athletes of Texas and will be deeply missed. He is survived by his loving wife of 56 years, Sarah Lou Jobson; daughter, Debbie Jobson; sons, Travis Richard Jobson Carmen, Jay Don Jobson Sylvia; sister, Virginia Alder; grandchildren, Justin, Jared, Cody and Caitlin Jobson, Randi Martin Adam, Ty Jobson; niece, Susan Marrett; and nephew, Jamie Alder.
