We were the same age basically and I enjoyed talking with him and making jokes. I remember that one morning just the two of us went to breakfast after Mass. I started asking him questions about his mental issues (schizophrenia) and he told me how he had developed it in his early 20's and thought that his drug use at that time might have contributed to it. I asked him what having schizophrenia was like and he said that he constantly hears voices. I asked him if he was hearing voices right now and he said "Yes." Then, I told him "If those voices start telling you to kill the lady sitting opposite you, please give me a heads up!" He really laughed at that and I always felt very comfortable asking questions and joking with him. Unfortunately, I left Holy Name Church in 2014 and only recently found out that Mac had passed. The last time I saw him was in 2025 when he came to Mass at St. Jerome's Church and I motioned to him to come sit with me. We didn't get to talk because he left church early to go smoke a cigarette. He was always so restless and I am glad that he is finally at rest. Cathy Kelley
