Dr. Johnson was a veteran of Vietnam, having served his country in the U.S. Army, and was the recipient of the Bronze Star. He was a graduate of Southwest Texas Medical School in Dallas, The University of Texas, and served his internship and residency at Robert B. Green Medical Center. He was a practicing physician and surgeon for over 39 years. He was involved in many civic organizations and served his community in many ways. In the medical profession, Dr. Johnson was a member of the American College of Surgeons, American Medical Association, American Society for Gastrointestinal Endoscopy, General Surgical Society of San Antonio, San Antonio Surgical Society, Texas Medical Association, Texas Surgical Society, South Texas Chapter American College of Surgeons, Founding member of the Society of American Gastrointestinal Endoscopic Surgeons, J.B. Aust Society, Bexar County Medical Society and the Society of Laparoendoscopic Surgeons. He was certified by the American Board of Surgery and was appointed as Clinical Associated Professor of General Surgery at the University of Texas Health Science Center. Dr. Johnson was the past Chief of Staff and Chief of Surgery at Metropolitan Methodist Hospital, and also was the past Chief of Staff at the Nix Memorial Hospital. He presently was serving on the Board of Governors for the Methodist Health Care System and was also Chief of Surgery at Nix Memorial Hospital. He was a past member of the Board of Directors for San Antonio Savings Association and the San Antonio

Country Club. He was a member of the Order of the Alamo, San Antonio German Club, Texas Cavaliers, Order of St. Hubertus and also the Conopus Club.

Hugh was a graduate of Alamo Heights High School. He joined the U.S. Marines and served 5 years. During that time he served in Operation Enduring Freedom in Afghanistan and also Operation Iraqi Freedom. Sgt. Johnson received the Good Conduct Medal, the Humanitarian Service Medal, Sea Service Deployment Ribbon, National Defense Medal; Navy Unit Commendation; Letter of Appreciation; Meritorious Mast; Expert Rifle Badge and the Sharpshooter Pistol Badge. Sgt Johnson was a member of the San Antonio German Club, Order of the Alamo and the San Antonio Country Club. Funeral services will be held at 10:00 AM on Saturday, November 20 at Trinity Baptist Church with Reverends Buckner Fanning and Louis H. Zbinden, Jr. officiating. Interment with military honors will follow at Mission Burial Park South.
