Hugh Madison Lindsey was born on May 2, 1915 in Laurel, Mississippi and went to be with the Lord on March 16, 2009. He obtained his Bachelor's and Master's Degree from Baylor University and his Master of Theology Degree from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary. Hugh was also a graduate of Chaplains School at Harvard University. He was an Army officer in WWII 1943 - 1946 and served in combat as an Army Chaplain in the Pacific theatre. Churches he pastored included Hot Wells Baptist Church in San Antonio, First Baptist Church in Griffin, GA, Riverside Baptist Church in San Antonio, and Wooster Baptist Church in Baytown, TX. In retirement he served with the Home Mission Board in starting new churches. He was currently a member of Crossroads Baptist Church. He

is preceded in death by his first wife of 54 years, Evelyn Lindsey. Hugh is survived by his wife of 14 years, Benell Lindsey; daughters, Margaret Ann Rogers, Janelle Lindley, 10 grandchildren and 19 great grandchildren.
