



Hugo Alberto Herbeck

May 23, 1923 - July 11, 2009

Hugo Alberto Herbeck, born May 23, 1923 in Laredo, Texas, died July 11, 2009 at the age of 86. He was married to Roberta Vicedomini, the love of his life, for 63 years. They met in Caserta, Italy where he was stationed with the U.S. Army during WWII. He brought his wife to the U.S. in 1946, and eventually settled in San Antonio where they raised their four daughters. As an artist, he is widely known throughout Texas for his oil and pallet knife landscapes. His love of the Texas Hill Country influenced his artwork and is evident in the vivid bluebonnet landscapes that were his trademark. His work has been published, most recently, in "Southwest Art" and "American Art Review" magazines. Through the years his paintings have been displayed in galleries throughout Texas and the remainder of his work can still be seen at the Rainone Galleries, Inc. in Arlington, Texas. When Peter Rainone, owner of the gallery, learned of Hugo's death he said, "Hugo Herbeck was the last of the great early Texas landscape painters." He is survived by his wife Roberta, their four daughters, Patricia Campos and Clarence Staples, Sandra Gonzalez and husband John, Liliana Dowling and husband Don, Beverly Anderson and husband Henry, brother Hector Herbeck and wife Estela, sister Irma Pena, sister Edna Williams and husband Randy, nine grandchildren, numerous great grandchildren, nieces and nephews. He passed away peacefully, at home, with his wife and daughters at his side. A private service, attended by family and close friends, was held July 21, 2009 at Mission Park Funeral Chapels North.
