July 4, 1928 - September 6, 2023

Irma C. Leal passed away on September 6 at the age of 95. Irma was born July 4, 1928, to Tomás Castillo and Josefina González Castillo in Weslaco, Texas.

She is preceded in death by her husband of 69 years, Ernesto Sr, and sons Ernesto Jr (Linda) and Richard, who died as an infant, and her brother José Ramón Castillo.

An Air Force wife, she resided in Yokohama and Yokota, Japan; Topeka and Pratt, Kansas; Burns Flat, Oklahoma; and San Antonio, Texas, where she and her family settled in 1955.

A longtime member of St. Lawrence Catholic Church and a devout Christian, she worked alongside her husband, who became a deacon in 1999. A devoted mother, grandmother, and great-grandmother, she always put her children before herself and was wholeheartedly supportive, stressing faith in God and the pursuit of a good education.
